

Congrats on your return to Kansas City and a really full plate. One of your many hats is programming The Wolf-WDAF. Have you been warned about the different culture in radio/label relationships regarding Country? The industry actually assigns number one push weeks and every one cooperates. Crazy.

I wouldn't say warned...lol...I have been told the relationship between country labels and radio programmers is certainly different than what I've experienced in the pop world. I guess we'll see...

You've had an amazing and success programming run at WZPL in Indy for like, a dozen years. What will you miss most about that station.

Easy: the people. I was fortunate to work with some incredibly talented and smart people. The Smiley Morning Show (Dave, Nikki, Toni, Will & Cole) are hands down some of the funniest people I've ever been around - on and off the air. They made my job so easy and I will be forever grateful for the time I got to spend with them.

It's a 7 hour drive from Indianapolis to KC. You're loading at 20 ft. U-Haul with a 87 Ford Econoline Cargo Van without a heater. 3 people are gonna show up to help you pack, load, drive and unload. There is an artist, another radio programmer and a label rep. Who would they be?


Wow...let's see... Taylor Swift, mainly 'cause I'm just a huge fan - love everything about her ...Chase Daniels (Audacy/Madison), I've worked with Chase in 3 markets and he's one of the most gifted guys in radio and one of my best friends....and for the label rep, I'd have to go with Michael Chase (Warner Nashville)...he's like the brother I never had. I hazed him so horribly for the first few years of our relationship, but he survived turned into a great friend and one that I've been able to count on - going on twenty years now.

There's been a lot of "reaching across the aisle" musically lately. Elle King/Miranda Lambert, blackbear/Kane Brown, Adele/Chris Stapleton to name a few. What are your thoughts on stations and formats sharing artists? I think it's terrific.

I love when creative people push limits and break molds. I don't think the average listener cares about format silos - artists are artists and hits are hits.

If you had the time to send Thank You notes with a 10 dollar Starbucks gift card to some of your favorite people who have influenced you both personally and professionally, who would be on that list?

Gosh...there's not enough time in the day to name everyone, but the first names that pop in my head are Dan Bowen, my boss at Star 94 in Atlanta. He was the first programmer in my career to let me see behind the curtain and really teach me why we were doing what we were doing. Up to that point, my bosses would tell me what to do and I did it, Dan was the first person to really teach me. Don Benson had a huge impact on my career - he had a hand in bringing me to Atlanta and you just can't help but learn something new in every conversation with Don; he's so smart. In fact, I've been lucky to be able to be around a lot of really smart and generous people over the last 30 years; Mark Kanov, Steve Reynolds, Herndon Hasty, Pat Paxton, Jenny Skjodt, Doug Hammond - I owe all those people and so many more for helping me become who I am today.

RJ CURTIS DISCUSSES THE LATEST CRS DEVELOPMENTS



Dude, sounds like you're rolling out the heavy artillery for Covid protocols and protection. Can you walk us through what to expect once we walk into the door?

The process starts before you arrive, by downloading the 3p America Smart Verify App (registered attendees will be receiving that via email this week), and uploading your vax, or negative Covid results. This process takes minutes and the app is very intuitive. I want to also point out that we're utilizing this third party vendor so we can easily, efficiently, and safely check-in a high volume of people in a short window of time, with information administered by health professionals, which we are not. 3P America does this work all the time, for events larger than CRS, most of them entertainment related. Additionally, the CRS portal is customized for our event, and data uploaded to this program will not be shared or archived, as 3P America complies with all HIPPA regulations. It will exist for the purposes of CRS Feb. 23-25 and that's it. It will be deleted after wards.

Once that info on on-boarded attendees will immediately receive a QR code, which will be scanned upon arrival, verifying their Vax or test status. They will then proceed to check-in, pick up their badge, etc, and have a fantastic CRS experience. If anyone wants a test during the week, we will provide at CRS cost - and we'll even test attendees on Saturday morning before they head home, if they want one.

As far as CRS sanctioned events "off campus", what are the rules and regulations?

We don't have any off campus sanctioned events, other than the Team UMG Lunch at the Ryman on Thursday (2/24). Since that doesn't take place in the CRS event space at the Omni, whatever protocols, if any, are the decision of the Ryman, and the event organizer for that day. I know from attending several shows at the Ryman in the past two months, regulations have varied, in terms of vax/test proof, or masking. That will be UMG's call and once they announce their lineup, we'll know more.

On an average, how many miles do you put on your bike each week?


The goal has always been to get in at least 100 outdoor miles a week, which can be done between Saturday and Sunday, weather permitting. In daylight hours and during warmer months, with opportunities to get out earlier in the morning or evenings after work, I have sometimes logged 200-300 in a week. The weather here in the Nashville area has been atypically miserable since the new year. Thanks to that, and shifting all my waking hours to focus on CRS preparation, my mileage for 2022 so far is a grand total of 126, which makes me sad to admit. If anyone needs to reach me the day after CRS ends (Feb. 26), don't bother - I'll be outside, on a bike, decompressing, and finding my happy place. Come. Monday Feb. 28, I'm all yours again.

For a CRS first-timer who had a lil bit of free time, where would you suggest they visit? A cool landmark? An off the beaten path restaurant?

The Country Music Hall of Fame is right next door to the Omni and is a fantastic destination. Stand in the rotunda, among all those plaques - if you don't have an emotional reaction to those legends, and the vibe in that space, we can't be friends. Take a walk on the pedestrian bridge for some fresh air, and enjoy the Cumberland River, with a picturesque, stunning skyline sa backdrop. Walk a few blocks North to the State Capitol - it's a cool building. Go for a drink at Old Glory just off Music Row, on Edgehill and Villa. And, I suppose as a rite of passage, you could go to lower Broadway for a drive by - it's not my thing (I think it's a shit show), but for those of you who love people watching, or rubber-necking a fairly horrific automobile accident on the Side of the road, go for it - but don't stay long, and then come back k to CRS at the Omni!

For us CRS Veterans, what is brand spanking new this year to which we can look for?

We are bringing back Streaming Summit and making it an all-day tract. It was a first-time agenda piece on our Virtual Experience last year - now it's live and in person. It's a stellar agenda which is appealing to our friends in the digital space, and important for radio execs to see, The Heads of State Speaker series is new, and will put attendees in front of label and music industry CEOs, who will share insights on where this entire business is, and where it's headed. I think the most important thing is that we are in person again, where connections and relationships are formed, and strengthened. CRS is a three-day pop-up community of industry pros who care deeply about our genre. This is the legacy of CRS - it has been built by the people who attend, the passion they bring to CRS, the takeaways they bring home, and their relentless determination to grow and sustain our collective success.


